

Hurricane Hermine After-Action Report

Report and Recommendations to the Leon County Board of County Commissioners

December 13, 2016

- 110 findings, 80 recommendations
- 5 community listening sessions;
 400 citizens in attendance
- Completed within 90 days
- 75 of 80 recommendations (94%) completed to date

Communication by the numbers

- 3 press conferences following landfall
- 35 news advisories reaching 400,000 citizens
- 70 social media posts generating more than 17,000 likes and shares
- 305,123 engagements on Facebook, 330,000 people reached on Twitter
- Dozens of radio spots used to promote comfort station and water distribution

IN CASE OF FIRE **EXIT BUILDING BEFORE TWEETING ABOUT IT**

- Social media during disaster
 - Organization controls own message
 - Responsive, agile, and relevant
 - Does not reach all populations
 - Significant issues during extended power outages
- Radio remains relevant
- Equip points of distribution with latest information



Critical Public Information

- Shelter and comfort station status
- Impacts on operations, offices, and schools
- Food and water distribution
- Restaurants, gas stations, and grocery stories with power
- Debris collection and schedule
- Status of utility restoration




What Hermine Left Behind



- 35,118 tons collected (175,590 cubic yards)
 - Or 11,000 dump trucks
 - Or 2.2 million kegs of beer
- 57,627 hangers cut
- 339 leaners cut
- \$6.1 million in debris removal
- \$1.4 million in monitoring






ZONE MAP

Collection Operations and Public Information

- Operations snapshot: simultaneous collection
- Communicating the collection plan with three-day schedules
- Anticipate reopening schools and impacts of cut and toss
- Embed / coordinate with utility crews when clearing roads
