## 1. INTRODUCTION



## Introduction & Methods

This document presents regional findings from a 2007-2008 survey of Florida residents conducted as part of the Statewide Regional Evacuation Study. The primary aim of the survey was to provide data to assist in deriving evacuation behavioral assumptions for transportation and shelter analyses. The main focus of the survey was hurricane evacuation, but questions were also asked about evacuation due to freshwater flooding, wildfires, hazardous material accidents, and nuclear power plant accidents. The survey included questions that are important in developing accurate behavioral projections for transportation and shelter planning but also incorporated questions deemed useful by county emergency management officials. Meetings were held with county and regional planning council representatives to discuss the questionnaire and related survey issues.

In each non-coastal county of the state 150 interviews were conducted randomly by telephone. In each coastal county of the state 400 interviews were conducted. The interviews were allocated among aggregations of hurricane evacuation zones (e.g., category 1-2) in the respective counties. The aggregation of zones and allocations of interviews among the zones were determined after input from county and regional representatives and varied among counties and regions. Selections were also made in order to reflect aggregations of zones currently used operationally and in public information materials by counties and to provide appropriate distributions of data that would be necessary to derive behavioral projections as required by the Statewide Regional Evacuation Study. In order to ensure that respondents resided in the evacuation zones of interest, addresses were selected first, and then telephone number at those addresses. By necessity only residences with land-line telephones were called, as sampling was conducted by address.

For non-coastal counties, tables in this document report survey findings for the county without geographical breakdowns. For coastal counties, tables summarize survey findings in several ways geographically. For the region and for each county, results for all evacuation zones are aggregated, without weighting the zones to reflect actual populations in each zone. Results are also presented by evacuation zone for the region, and the regional aggregations for zones are also not weighted to reflect actual population variations among counties. Finally, results are presented for each evacuation zone within each county. In one respect this is the most accurate level of reporting, because findings are not being mixed with those for other locations. However, this is also the reporting level with the smallest number of respondents, and statistical reliability is poorer for smaller samples. For every coastal county and for every region with coastal counties, tables report findings for six evacuation zones (category 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 surge-related evacuation zones, plus non-surge areas). In locations where zones were aggregated the tables show the same data for each zone separately (for cat 1 and 2, for example). This is done to achieve uniformity of tables among counties and regions, but tables should not be misconstrued to infer that sample sizes apply to each zone separately. Tables are formatted to make clear instances where sample sizes are “shared” among zones.

For hazards other than hurricanes, sample sizes are smaller. In most counties one-third of the respondents were asked about freshwater flooding or wildfires or hazardous material accidents. In counties within the emergency planning zone for a nuclear power plant, one-fourth of the respondents were asked about one of the previously listed hazards or about nuclear power plants.






## 2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



### Information about Hurricanes

Nearly seven out of ten Apalachee region residents (69%) have access to the Internet. One in five of these individuals (20%) claims to have visited their county's website to search for information about hurricanes. Nearly seven out of ten residents (69%) in the Apalachee region maintain they have seen a map of their county showing areas that need to evacuate in case of hurricanes.

### Awareness of Evacuation Zones

One in three residents (34%) of the coastal counties in the Apalachee region believes they live in an evacuation zone. Knowledge about one's evacuation zone is limited as shown below:

### Perceived Danger from Hurricanes

Percentages of residents in the Apalachee region who believe hurricanes of varying strengths pose safety risks from flooding for their homes increase exponentially with the strength of hurricanes:

### Emergency Management Officials

Percentages of residents who feel that Emergency Management officials will issue evacuation notices saying resident should leave their homes to seek safer locations increase significantly as storm strength increases.



Significant percentages of residents say they intend to evacuate their homes even when the evacuation notice does not apply directly to them. Shadow evacuations increase as storm strength increases.

### Evacuation Destination

Regardless of the hurricane strength, pluralities of residents in the Apalachee region intend to go to friends or relatives if they evacuate. Minor changes in evacuation destinations occur as hurricanes strengthen. One in six residents of the Apalachee region plans to go to a hurricane shelter to escape hurricanes of all strengths.

Most residents intend to evacuate to other places in Florida regardless of hurricane strength. Percentages of residents who intend to evacuate outside Florida increase considerably as hurricanes strengthen to a category 5. Most residents who intend to evacuate outside Florida will go to Georgia.



### Hurricane Planning

Nearly six in ten households (59%) have definite plans for deciding to evacuate and where to go. The typical household plans to take one and a half vehicles (1.5) during an evacuation. One in six households (17%) plans to take a motor home, pull a trailer, boat, etc., when they evacuate.

### Issues Impacting Evacuation

Six in ten residents (60%) in the Apalachee region have pets: 80% of these residents plan to take their pets with them if they evacuate. Most residents with pets (86%) are aware that public shelters will not accept pets inside, and 3% of these residents claim they will not evacuate because of this.

One in ten households (10%) contains an individual who requires assistance during evacuation; 7% of all households in the Apalachee region have an individual who is disabled, has a medical condition or requires some other type of special assistance beyond transportation assistance; and 2% of all households in the Apalachee region will require assistance from an outside agency for the person who is disabled. Only 6% of all households in the Apalachee region require transportation assistance during hurricane evacuation.

### 3. Sources of Information About Hurricanes

#### Do you have access to the Internet so you could look up information about hurricanes?

Seven out of ten residents (69%) in the Apalachee region have access to the Internet so they can search for information

about hurricanes. Residents in non-surge zones (74%) are slightly more likely to have Internet access, while inland county residents (66%) are less likely.



### 3. Sources of Information About Hurricanes

#### Have you ever visited your county's website to look up information about hurricanes?

One in five residents (20%) in the Apalachee region report visiting their county's website to look up information about

hurricanes. Incidence of accessing county websites is greater in evacuation zones 2 and 3 (27%), while only 15% of inland county residents report accessing their county's website to look up information about hurricanes.



### Have you ever seen a map of your county showing areas that would need to evacuate in case of a hurricane?

Seven out of ten residents (69%) in the Apalachee region maintain they have seen a map of their county showing areas that need to evacuate in case of hurricanes. Results were stable across evacuation zones with a high of 71% and a low of 68%.


#### Count-Level Results

Residents of Franklin (75%), Wakulla (72%), and Gulf (71%) counties are more likely to say they have seen maps with evacuation zones, while only 52% of Jefferson County residents report seeing maps with evacuation zones delineated.

## 4. Awareness of Evacuation Zones

*Your county has identified storm surge areas that people would need to evacuate in certain hurricanes. Do you live in one of the storm surge hurricane evacuation zones or do you live in an area that would not be affected by storm surge?*

Residents of coastal counties were asked if they lived in areas identified by their counties as storm surge areas, i.e., areas that would need to evacuate in certain hurricanes. One in three residents (34%) of the coastal counties in the Apalachee region believes they live in an evacuation zone. Residents who live in evacuation zone 1 (50%) are much more likely than other residents to surmise that they live in an evacuation zone. Conversely, only 23% of inland county residents believe they live in areas requiring evacuation during hurricanes.



### County-Level Results

Responses vary drastically across the four coastal counties as only 6% of residents in Jefferson County believe they live in an evacuation zone, and 48% of residents in Franklin County believe they live in an evacuation zone.

### Awareness of Storm Surge Evacuation Zone

Residents of coastal counties in the Apalachee region who claim they live in evacuation zones were asked to indicate the evacuation zone in which they live. Majorities of residents in each evacuation zone do not know in which evacuation zone they live. For example, 77% of residents who live in evacuation zone 1 either do not know they live there or believe they live in another evacuation zone; and 77% of residents in evacuation zone 2 either do not know they live there or believe they live in another evacuation zone.

Relatively few residents can identify correctly the evacuation zone in which they live. The following percentages of residents each evacuation zone correctly identify their evacuation zone:

### County-Level Results

When looking strictly at evacuation zone residents, Franklin County residents are most likely (38%) to know in which evacuation zone they live, while Jefferson County residents are least likely.


A category 2 hurricane has winds of 100 miles per hour. If a category 2 hurricane with 100 mile per hour winds passed directly over your location, do you believe storm surge or waves would reach your home and cause flooding severe enough to pose a serious danger to your safety?

Only 17% of residents in the Apalachee region believe a category 2 hurricane poses serious danger to their safety. Residents living in evacuation zone 1 (31%) are more likely to believe a category 2 storm will pose a serious threat to their safety. Only 10% of inland county residents share this opinion.

#### County-Level Results

Franklin County residents (30%) are more likely to believe a category 2 hurricane represents serious danger to their safety. Few residents in Liberty (4%) and Calhoun (8%) counties think that a category 2 hurricane represents serious danger. For the most part, regardless of county residents living in evacuation zone 1 are more likely to believe a category 2 storm represents danger to their safety.


Remembering that a category 1 is the weakest and 5 is the strongest; a category 3 hurricane has winds of 125 miles per hour. Emergency management officials call it a major hurricane. If a category 3 hurricane with 125 mile per hour winds passed directly over your location, do you believe storm surge or waves would reach your home and cause flooding severe enough to pose a serious danger to your location?

Not quite one in three residents (32%) of the Apalachee region believes that storm surge or waves from a category 3 hurricane that passed directly over them would cause flooding severe enough to pose a serious danger to their location. Reactions to this question differ across evacuation zones as 50% of residents in evacuation zone 1 and 41% of residents in evacuation zones 2 and 3 feel that storm surge or waves from a category 3 hurricane that passed directly over them would cause flooding severe enough to pose a serious danger to their location, while only 22% of inland county residents feel this way.

### County-Level Results

More residents in Franklin County (49%) and Gulf County (41%) feel they would be in serious danger from a category 3 hurricane, while only 18% of Calhoun County residents express this opinion. A comparatively high percentage of residents (64%) living in evacuation zone 1 in Franklin County perceive they will be in serious danger if a category 3 hurricane with 125 mile per hour winds passed directly over them.


Nearly half of residents (46%) in the Apalachee region think storm surge or waves from a category 4 hurricane passing directly over them should reach their homes and cause severe enough flooding to pose serious danger to their safety.

There is not much variation in responses to this question across residents living in evacuation zones 1 through 4 (60% to 71%), while only 43% of residents in evacuation zone 5 feel they will be in danger from a category 4 hurricane and even lower percentages of residents living in non-surge zones (31%) and inland counties (35%) feel this way.

### County-Level Results

Franklin County (73%) residents are more likely than residents in other counties within the Apalachee region to believe their homes will be in danger from storm surge or waves from a category 4 hurricane. Only 29% of Calhoun County and Liberty County residents believe their homes will be in serious danger from storm surge or waves from a category 4 hurricane.



Six out of ten residents (58%) believe they can safely survive a category 2 hurricane despite 100 mile per hour winds and flooding and remain in their homes. Results vary somewhat across evacuation zones with fewer residents in evacuation zone 1 (48%) believing they can survive safely in their homes despite the flooding and winds accompanying a category 2 hurricane. Six in ten inland residents (62%) believe they will be safe in their homes under these hurricane conditions.

#### County-Level Results

Results vary across counties in the Apalachee region with a high of 68% of Leon County residents thinking they will be safe in their homes during a category 2 hurricane and only 47% of Franklin County residents holding this belief.


Considering both wind from the hurricane and flooding, do you think it would be safe for you to stay in your home or building if a category 3 hurricane with 125 MPH winds passed directly over your location?

Only three in ten Apalachee region residents (30%) think it is safe to stay in their homes if a category 3 storm with 125 mile per hour winds passed directly over them. Results vary slightly across evacuation zones as 23% of residents in evacuation zone 1 feel this way and 28% of residents in evacuation zone 5 feel this way. Slightly more residents in inland counties (35%) feel they will be safe in their homes from the wind and flooding of a category 3 hurricane.

### County-Level Results

Results vary significantly across counties in the Apalachee region as a high of 49% of Liberty County residents feel it is safe to stay in their homes if a category 3 storm with 125 mile per hour winds passed directly over them and a low of 22% of Franklin County residents share this opinion.



Only 16% of residents in the Apalachee region perceive it is safe to stay in their homes if a category 4 hurricane passed directly over them. This is a precipitous drop from the percentages of residents who believe it is safe to stay in their homes if a category 2 (58%) or category 3 (30%) hurricane passed directly over them. Inland county residents (20%) are more likely to believe it is safe to stay in their homes if category 4 hurricane passed directly over them, while only 13% of residents in evacuation zone 1 feel safe.

### County-Level Results

Responses to this question vary from a low of 12% in Gulf County to a high of 23% in Jackson County who feel it is safe to ride out a category 4 hurricane in their homes.



Results vary across evacuation zones as 73% of residents living in evacuation zone 1 but only 45% of inland county residents think Emergency Management officials would issue an evacuation notice during a category 2 storm.

#### County-Level Results

Percentages of residents in the Apalachee region who believe they will be ordered to evacuate varies significantly across counties with a high of 72% in Franklin County and a low of 37% in Leon County.



Four out of five residents (80%) think Emergency Management officials would issue evacuation notices saying residents should leave their homes in the event that a category 3 hurricane comes into their area. More residents living in evacuation zones 1 (86%), 2 (85%), and 3 (85%) feel this way, while 73% of inland county residents think Emergency Management officials would issue evacuation notices saying residents should leave their homes in the event that a category 3 hurricane comes into their area.

#### County-Level Results

Responses to this question vary widely across counties as a high of 90% of Franklin County residents and a low of 62% of Leon County residents think Emergency Management officials would issue evacuation notices saying residents should leave their homes in the event that a category 3 hurricane comes into their area.

Over nine out of ten Apalachee region residents (91%) think Emergency Management officials would issue an evacuation notice saying they have to leave their homes if a category 4 hurricane with 155 mile per hour winds hits their area. High percentages of residents in all evacuation zones and in inland counties (88% to 94%) think Emergency Management officials would issue evacuation notices in the event of a category 4 hurricane.


#### County-Level Results

At least 83% of residents in all counties in the Apalachee region think Emergency Management officials would issue mandatory evacuation notices in the event of a category 4 hurricane with a high of 96% in Franklin and Wakulla counties' residents sharing this opinion.



Nearly three in four residents (74%) of the Apalachee region intend to leave their homes to seek safer locations if Emergency Management officials did issue mandatory evacuation notices because of potential flooding from a category 1 or 2 hurricane. Reactions to this question are very similar across evacuation zones ranging from a low of 70% in evacuation zones 4 and 5 to a high of 74% in evacuation zone 1 and in inland counties.

#### County-Level Results

County-level results are stable across counties as a high of 78% of Jefferson County residents and a low of 71% of Franklin County residents say they will follow mandatory evacuation orders in the event of possible flooding from a category 1 or 2 hurricane.



Nearly nine out of ten residents (87%) living in the Apalachee region intend to leave their homes in the event of a category 3 hurricane if told to do so by Emergency Management officials. Responses are nearly identical across evacuation zones with a high of 88% in evacuation zones 2 and 3 and a low of 86% in evacuation zones 4 and 5.

#### County-Level Results

Responses to this question vary somewhat across counties: a high of 91% of Leon County residents and a low of 84% of Jackson County residents intend to leave their homes in the event of a mandatory evacuation notice due to a category 3 hurricane.










### Evacuation Rates Depending on Perceived Vulnerability in a Category 1 or 2 Hurricane



Over half of Apalachee region residents (59%) who live outside the mandatory evacuation area say they intend to evacuate if officials issue a mandatory evacuation notice for everyone living in areas that would be affected by flooding in a category 1 or 2 hurricane and everyone living in mobile homes or manufactured housing in the entire region. Residents living in inland counties (64%) are most likely to say they intend to evacuate under these circumstances.

#### County-Level Results

Shadow evacuation is greatest in Gadsden County (81%) in the face of a category 1 or 2 hurricane, while shadow evacuation is lowest in Leon County (29%).


Suppose that officials DID issue a mandatory evacuation notice saying that everyone living in areas that would be affected by flooding in a category 1, 2 or 3 hurricane and everyone living in mobile homes or manufactured housing in your county must evacuate their homes and go to a safer location. In that case, would you leave your home to go someplace safer?

Over three out of four residents (78%) of the Apalachee Region who live in evacuation zones 4 and 5, 76% of residents in non-surge zones, and 75% of inland county residents intend to evacuate when faced with the threat of a category 3 hurricane even though the evacuation notice does not pertain to them.

#### County-Level Results

Shadow evacuation is greatest in Liberty County (88%) in the face of a category 3 hurricane, while shadow evacuation is lowest in Leon County (57%).


Suppose that officials DID issue a mandatory evacuation notice saying that everyone living in areas that would be affected by flooding in a category 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 hurricane and everyone living in mobile homes or manufactured housing in your county must evacuate their homes and go to a safer location. In that case, would you leave your home to go someplace safer?

Nearly all residents of the Apalachee Region who live in non-surge zones (95%) and inland counties (93%) intend to evacuate when faced with the threat of a category 5 hurricane even though the evacuation notice does not pertain to them.

#### County-Level Results

Shadow evacuation for a category 5 hurricane in non-surge zones and inland counties varies from a low of 89% in Gulf and Jefferson counties to a high of 99% in Franklin County.

### Evacuation Rates Based on Perceived Vulnerability

The tables on this and the subsequent two pages show the percentages of residents who say they will evacuate based on various warnings from Emergency Management officials and based on their perceptions of whether or not they would be safe remaining in their homes.

#### At risk zones – evacuation zones 1 & 2 + mobile homes

Six in ten residents (60%) living in the Apalachee region plan to evacuate based on a mandatory evacuation notice for evacuation zones 1 and 2 + mobile homes. Propensity for evacuating under these conditions peaks in evacuation zone 1 and in inland counties (64%) and is lowest in non-surge zones (54%).

#### At risk zones – evacuation zones 1, 2 & 3 + mobile homes

Three out of four residents (76%) living in the Apalachee region plan to evacuate based on a mandatory evacuation notice for evacuation zones 1, 2, and 3 + mobile homes. Propensity for evacuating under these conditions is highest in evacuation zones 1 through 3 (81%) and lowest in inland counties (75%).


#### At risk zones – evacuation zones 1 through 5 + mobile homes

Over nine out of ten residents (92%) living in the Apalachee region plan to evacuate based on a mandatory evacuation notice for evacuation zones 1 through 5 mobile homes with 95% of residents living in non-surge zones and 93% of inland county residents saying they will evacuate even though the evacuation order does not apply to them.

### Intention to Evacuate by Notification Scenario





#### At risk zones – evacuation zones 1 & 2 + mobile homes

After an evacuation notice for evacuation zones 1, 2, and mobile homes, over half of residents (52%) living in the Apalachee region who feel safe in their homes plan to evacuate. Conversely, after a mandatory evacuation notice for evacuation zones 1, 2, and mobile homes, 77% of residents in the Apalachee region who do not feel safe in their homes plan to evacuate.


#### Shadow Evacuation Rates Depending on Perceived Vulnerability in Evacuation Zones 1 and 2


#### Shadow Evacuation Rates Depending on Perceived Vulnerability in Evacuation Zones 1, 2, and 3

Residents of the Apalachee region are more likely to go to friends or relatives if they leave their homes in the event that a category 2 hurricane strikes their area. Four in ten residents (41%) will evacuate to friends or relatives. Nearly one in five residents (18%) will travel to a shelter operated by a county or the Red Cross, while one in six residents (16%) will go to a hotel or motel. Comparatively more residents living in inland counties (25%) plan to evacuate to a public shelter.

### County-Level Results

Percentages of residents who plan to evacuate to a public shelter vary considerably across counties as 39% of Gadsden County residents and 28% of Liberty County residents plan to do so, while only 7% of Franklin County residents say they will go to a public shelter in the event of a category 1 or 2 hurricane.

Planned evacuation destinations during a category 3 hurricane are almost identical to those during a category 2 hurricane. A plurality of residents (41%) plan to go to friends and relatives if they evacuate during a category 3 hurricane. Inland county residents (24%) are still more likely than residents from other areas to plan to evacuate to a public shelter in the event of a category 3 hurricane. Not quite one in five residents (18%) plans to go to a hotel or motel to escape a category 3 hurricane.

### County-Level Results

In a category 3 hurricane, residents of Gadsden (35%) and Liberty (30%) counties are more likely to go to a public shelter than residents of other counties in the Apalachee region.

### If you DID evacuate during a category 5 hurricane, where would you go?

Planned evacuation patterns vary negligibly as hurricanes strengthen from a category 1 or 2 to 3 to 5. The percentages of residents who will evacuate to a public shelter actually decreases by only 1% point (to 17%) from a category 1 or 2 to a category 5 hurricane. A summary of intent to evacuate to a public shelter as hurricanes strengthen from a category 1 or 2 to a 3 to nearly a 5 is shown below:

18% Category 1 or 2 hurricane  
 17% Category 3 hurricane  
 17% Category 4 hurricane strengthening to a category 5

Nearly the same percentages of residents evacuate to a friends or relatives regardless of hurricane strength as shown below:

41% Category 2 hurricane  
 41% Category 3 hurricane  
 39% Category 4 hurricane strengthening to a category 5

Percentages of residents saying they will evacuate to hotels or motels increase slightly (16% to 19%) as hurricane strength increases.

### County-Level Results

Planned use of public shelters in the event of a category 5 hurricane vary significantly across counties in the Apalachee region as 35% of Gadsden County residents plan to do so, but only 6% of Franklin County residents plan to seek a public shelter if a category 5 hurricane heads their direction.





Two out of three Apalachee region residents (66%) have friends or relatives in safe locations with whom they could seek refuge in the event that a hurricane forced them to evacuate. Residents living in evacuation zone 1 (58%) are less likely than other residents to have friends or relatives with whom they can seek safe refuge.

### County-Level Results

Results vary significantly across counties. For example, residents in Gadsden County (81%) and Jefferson County (72%) are much more likely than residents in Calhoun County (47%) and Leon County (52%) to say they have friends or relatives in safe locations to which they can evacuate.

### Do you have any pets?

Six in ten residents (60%) in the Apalachee region have pets in their households. Incidence of pets is greatest in non-surge zones where 69% of residents have pets.



Eight out of ten Apalachee region pet owners (80%) plan to take their pets with them if they evacuate. Intent to include pets in the evacuation is consistent across all evacuation zones (83%), but only 73% of inland county residents will take their pets with them. Only 1% of residents in the Apalachee region claim they will stay at home with their pets during a hurricane.

#### County-Level Results

Percentages of residents in the Apalachee region who intend to take pets with them during evacuation vary widely across counties as more Franklin County residents (90%) plan to take their pets with them when they evacuate while only 63% of Liberty County residents plan to do so.





In the event of a category 2 hurricane, one out of three residents (34%) in the Apalachee region will evacuate to some other location within Florida that is outside their county, and 30% will evacuate to someplace outside the state. Nearly three in ten residents (28%) will evacuate within their own counties with proportionately more of these individuals leaving their own neighborhoods.

### **County-Level Results**

Gadsden County residents (54%) are comparatively more likely to stay in their own neighborhoods or county, while Leon County residents (47%) are more likely to evacuate to some location outside Florida, Franklin County residents (57%) are more likely to move to another location within Florida.

Evacuation destinations for a category 3 hurricane are slightly different from evacuation destinations for a category 2 hurricane. Comparatively more residents (34%) in the Apalachee region will leave the state in the event of a category 3 hurricane. One in three (33%) will find another location within the state, but outside of their county, while 27% will stay in their own counties.

#### County-Level Results

As with a category 1 storm, Gadsden County residents (52%) are comparatively more likely to stay in their own neighborhoods or county during a category 3 hurricane, while Leon County residents (51%) are more likely to evacuate to some location outside Florida, Franklin County residents (55%) are more likely to move to another location within Florida.

During evacuation from a category 5 hurricane, residents of the Apalachee region are more likely to seek refuge outside Florida and less likely to stay in their own counties than they are for less intense hurricanes. Inland residents are more likely to stay in their own neighborhoods and within their own counties.

**County-Level Results**

As with weaker storms, Gadsden County residents (49%) are comparatively more likely to stay in their own neighborhood or county, while Leon County residents (60%) are more likely to evacuate to some location outside Florida. Franklin County (45%) residents are more likely to move to another location within Florida.


### Summary of Evacuation Destinations Based on Intensity of Hurricanes

As hurricanes intensify, residents are more likely to seek shelter outside Florida. Conversely, residents are more likely to seek shelter from less intense hurricanes in their own counties and elsewhere in Florida as hurricanes intensify from a category 1 or 2 to 5. One in nine residents (11%) of the Apalachee region will remain in their neighborhoods regardless of hurricane strength.

Two out of three residents (67%) who will evacuate for a category 1 or 2 hurricane will stay in Florida. Inland county residents (66%) are less likely to stay in Florida than are other residents. Georgia is the second most preferred destination as 17% of residents claim they will go there if a category 2 storm hits; 20% of residents in non-surge zones will go to Georgia in the event of a category 1 or 3 hurricane.

**County-Level Results**  
Residents in Gadsden (75%), Wakulla (75%), Jefferson (73%), and Liberty (73%) counties are more likely to stay in Florida as a category 1 or 2 storm approaches. Leon County residents (32%) are comparatively more likely to go to Georgia as a category 2 hurricane enters the Apalachee region.

As with a category 2 hurricane, about two in three residents in the Apalachee region (64%) will evacuate within Florida if a category 3 hurricane strikes. One in five residents (20%) will evacuate to Georgia in the event of a category 3 hurricane, but comparatively more residents who live in non-surge zones (23%) will do so.

### County-Level Results

Liberty County (73%) and Gadsden County residents (71%) indicate the highest propensity for evacuating within Florida in the event of a category 3 hurricane, while Leon County residents (45%) are less likely to evacuate within Florida. More Leon County residents (34%) than residents from other counties will go to Georgia if they evacuate as a category 3 hurricane approaches. Counting Georgia, 42% of Leon County residents will evacuate to a southeastern state in the event of a category 3 hurricane.

The percentage of residents who will stay in Florida decreases to 57% as storm strength increases to a category 5 hurricane. Over one in three residents (35%) in the Apalachee region will go to other southeastern states if a category 5 hurricane approaches their area. Evacuation plans in the event of a category 5 hurricane do not vary considerably across evacuation zones, yet fewer inland county residents (55%) will stay in Florida.

### County-Level Results

Gadsden (66%) and Liberty (65%) residents are more likely to evacuate within Florida if a category 5 hurricane forces evacuation, while Leon County residents (36%) show a greater propensity to evacuate to Georgia. Including Georgia, 46% of Leon County residents will evacuate to other southeastern states in the event of a category 5 hurricane.


### *Summary of Evacuation Destinations Based on Intensity of Hurricanes*

As hurricanes intensify from a category 1 or 2 to a category 5, fewer residents will stay in Florida and slightly more will evacuate to Georgia. Georgia as an evacuation destination grows from 17% for category 1 or 2 storms to 24% for category 5 storms, and the southeast in general as an evacuation destination grows from 26% to 35%).



Nearly six in ten residents (59%) in the Apalachee region have a definite plan for deciding whether to evacuate and where they will go if threatened by a hurricane. Slightly higher percentages of residents living in evacuation zone 1 (71%) have definite plans.

### County-Level Results

There is considerable variation in the percentages of residents across counties who have definite plans as only 44% of residents in Gadsden County and only 45% of Jackson County residents say they have definite plans for deciding whether to evacuate and where to go if a hurricane threatens, while 72% of residents in Gulf County have definite plans.


How many vehicles would your household take if you evacuated?

The average household in the Apalachee region has over two (2.1) available vehicles in the event of an evacuation. Three percent (3%) of Apalachee region residents do not have a vehicle to use to evacuate. The average number of vehicles to be used in an evacuation is 1.5. Numbers of vehicles available for evacuation and numbers of vehicles that residents intend to use are nearly identical across evacuation zones.

#### County-Level Results

Variation in number of vehicles available for evacuation varies across counties from a high of 2.5 in Jefferson County to a low of 1.9 in Franklin, Gadsden, and Leon counties. Variation in the number of vehicles intended to use during evacuation is within a few tenths of a vehicle across counties in the Apalachee region.

One in six households (17%) in the Apalachee region will take a large vehicle (motor home, trailer, boat, camper) with them if they evacuate because of a hurricane. Residents in evacuation zone 1 (24%) are slightly more likely to take a motor home or pull a trailer, boat or camper during evacuation.

### County-Level Results

Wakulla County residents (24%) are more likely to take a motor home or to pull a conveyance if they evacuate, while Calhoun County residents (7%) are less likely to do so.



Over one in ten households (12%) claims that there are obstacles beyond transportation and disabilities/medical needs that create obstacles to evacuating. Residents living in evacuation zone 1 (16%) are more likely to believe there are obstacles to evacuation other than lack of transportation or special medical needs. Pets (20%), jobs (18%), and road obstructions (18%) are cited as the most critical obstacles to evacuation other than lack of transportation or medical/special needs. Residents living in evacuation zone 1 (18%) are more likely to think lack of money will be a problem.

### County-Level Results

Jackson County (17%) residents are more likely to think obstacles other than transportation and medical/special needs may keep them from evacuating. Pets are listed more often by Leon County (43%) and Jefferson County (34%) residents, while Wakulla County residents (15%) are more likely to list traffic as an impediment to evacuation. Gulf County residents (23%) are more likely to cite lack of money as an impediment to evacuation.



### Would the person just need transportation, or do they have a disability or medical problem that would require special assistance?

Two out of three households (65%) containing individuals needing assistance during hurricane evacuation have special needs (37% special needs + 28% special needs and transportation needs). This represents only 7% of all households. Over half of the households (55%) containing individuals needing special assistance require transportation (27% transportation + 28% special needs and transportation needs). It should be noted that these households represent only about 6% of all households in the Apalachee region. Households in evacuation zone 1 (8%) are slightly more likely to require transportation during evacuation, while households in evacuation zones 1 through 3 and inland counties are slightly more likely (7%) to have special needs during evacuation.

### County-Level Results

Comparatively high percentages of households in Gadsden County (13%) require special transportation during evacuation. Percentages of households in the Apalachee region that have special needs during evacuation are highest for Gadsden County (13%).









### Were You at Home for Hurricane Ivan?

























As the figures below show, more residents in the Apalachee region recall evacuating for Hurricane Dennis (22%) and Hurricane Kate (20%). Residents of the Apalachee region were more likely to go to friends and relatives during the hurricanes listed below. Percentages of residents who report evacuating to a public shelter range from 0% during Hurricane Jeanne to 5% during Hurricane Opal.

















Over seven out of ten households (72%) interviewed in the Apalachee region live in single-family, detached housing (see table on following page). There is a slightly greater incidence of single family, detached housing in evacuation zone 1 (74%). Over two in ten households (22%) in the Apalachee region is either a mobile home or a manufactured home.

#### County-Level Results

Incidence of detached, single-family housing ranges from a low of 60% in Jefferson County to a high of 79% in Gulf and Leon Counties. Mobile/manufactured housing ranges from a low of 3% in Leon County to a high of 32% in Jefferson County.







Nearly nine out of ten residents (89%) in the Apalachee region claim they intend to evacuate if ordered to do so by public safety officials because of wildfire threats. Intent to evacuate if ordered to do so is stable across evacuation zones.

Intent to evacuate varies across counties as 96% of Leon County residents say they intend to evacuate because of wildfires if ordered to do so by public safety officials, while only 77% of Liberty County residents intend to evacuate.

### Where would you go if you evacuated because of a wildfire?

Just about one in eight residents (12%) intend to go to public shelters if there is a need to evacuate because of wildfires. A plurality of residents (49%) intends to evacuate to friends and relatives, while 15% plan to go to a hotel or motel. Residents in evacuation zone 1 (56%) are more likely to go to a public shelter (although the sample size is small).

#### County-Level Results

Responses to this question vary across counties. For example, 24% of Gadsden County residents say they intend to evacuate to a public shelter, while few Leon County (3%) residents intend to do so. Over half of Leon County residents (57%) say they will go to friends and relatives, while only 30% of Liberty County residents will do so.


### Do you believe that your home might ever be threatened by freshwater flooding?



Three in four residents (76%) in the Apalachee region maintain they will evacuate their homes if ordered to do so by public safety officials because of freshwater flooding. This percentage is higher (83%) in non-surge zones. One in four residents (25%) in evacuation zone 1 say they will not leave their homes if ordered to do so in the event of fresh-water flooding.

### County-Level Results

Gadsden County (90%) and Jackson County (85%) residents are more likely to intend to evacuate because of freshwater flooding. Fewer residents of Franklin County (65%) say they will evacuate if ordered to do so because of freshwater flooding.

A plurality of residents (46%) intends to evacuate to friends or relatives if ordered to evacuate by public officials as a result of freshwater flooding. Residents living in inland counties (49%) are more likely to evacuate to friends and relatives. Over one in ten residents (12%) maintains they will go to public shelters with comparatively more residents in evacuation zone 1 (15%) and in inland counties (16%) planning to do so.

**County-Level Results**

Percentages of residents planning to go to public shelters in the event of freshwater flooding vary dramatically across counties as only 2% of Jackson County residents plan to do so, but 32% of Gadsden County residents will.







While relatively few residents (19%) believe that they are threatened by a future hazardous material accident, a high percentage (90%) say they intend to evacuate their homes if public safety officials ask them to do so in response to this type of accident. Residents living in all evacuation zones are quite likely to evacuate if told to do so, and 93% of residents in inland counties will evacuate if ordered.

### County-Level Results

Only 8% of residents in the Apalachee region say they intend to go to a public shelter if they evacuate from a hazardous material accident. A plurality of residents (45%) intends to go to friends or relatives. One in six (17%) intends to evacuate to a hotel or motel. Residents living in non-surge zones and inland counties are more likely to seek safety at public shelters (10%).

**County-Level Results**

Jefferson County and Wakulla County residents (52%) are more likely to go to friends and relatives, while Gadsden County residents (19%) are more likely to seek safety at public shelters.










