HURRICANE MICHAEL RECOVERY COST SHARE



- FEDERAL - **75%** Currently
- NON-FEDERAL - **25%** Split between State & Local
- 100% FOR 45 DAYS - Cat A and B ONLY
 - October 10, 2018 through November 24, 2018
- 90/10 Split - \$2.69 Billion Obligated (CY 2018)



HURRICANE MICHAEL RECOVERY LOCAL MATCH WAIVER

- There is a federal requirement for matching funds.
- BY STATUTE: the State will provide the entire required match amount for state agencies and one-half of the required match for grants awarded to local governments.



HURRICANE MICHAEL RECOVERY LOCAL MATCH WAIVER

- In extreme cases of hardship, eligible subgrantees have the option of applying for a waiver of the required match amount. Per section 252.37(5)(b), Florida Statutes.
- Application to Office of Policy and Budget (OPB)

HURRICANE MICHAEL RECOVERY LOCAL MATCH WAIVER

Requests will be reviewed with consideration to the following:

- Demographics: population size, poverty rate, unemployment rate;
- Storm Impacts: number of storms, severity of impact, non-FEMA reimbursable expenditures; additional hurricane recovery/mitigation funding granted, frequency of prior disasters, other assistance available;
- Tax/Revenue Capacity: millage rate, is the entity at maximum millage, are all utility taxes levied, can millage be increased to cover costs, per capita taxable value, fiscally constrained county;



HURRICANE MICHAEL RECOVERY LOCAL MATCH WAIVER

- Special Designations: financial distress, Rural Area of Critical Economic Concern;
- Financial Information: general fund reserves, revenues and expenditures of the entity, number of months of reserve in general fund, the local match requirement as a percentage of the general fund balance; and
- Other Considerations: unique to the local government.



HURRICANE MICHAEL RECOVERY DEBRIS OPERATIONS (FDOT)

Summary of Operations provided by letter from FDOT

- Final Pass Begin Date 3-15-19
 - Operations for “Final Pass” commences
- Final Pass Conclusion Date 4-15-19
 - FDOT will not pick up after this date
- Completion of Operations 5-31-19
 - By this date, reduction & final disposition should be finalized
- State Time Extension 7-11-19
 - This is the deadline for ALL debris operations to be completed
